

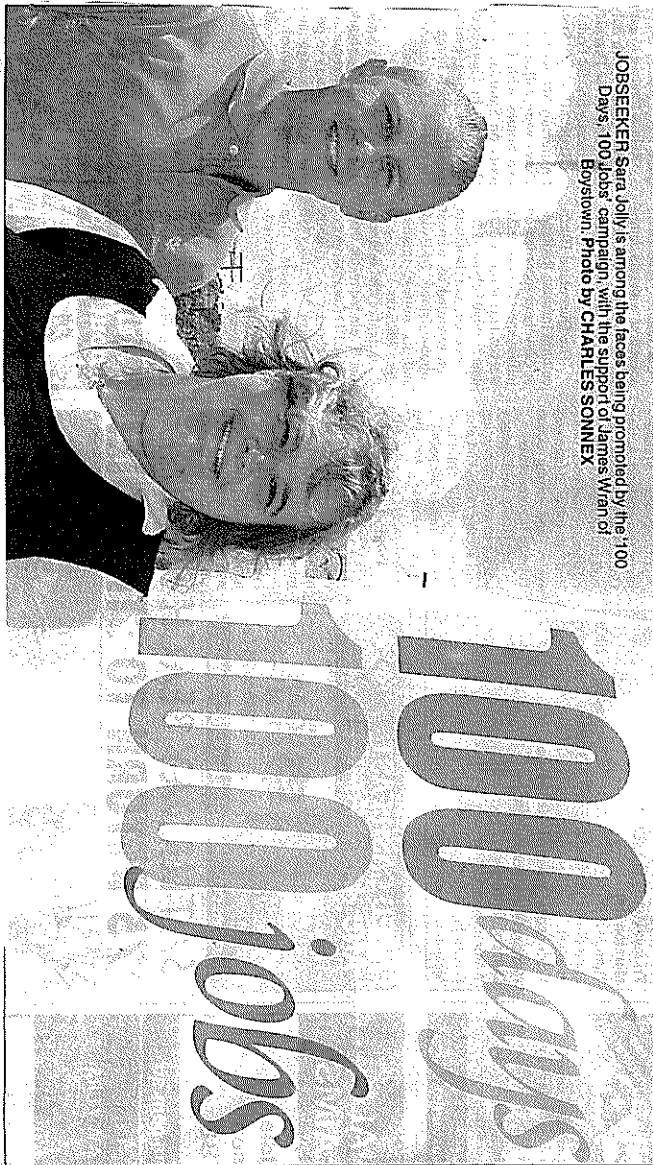

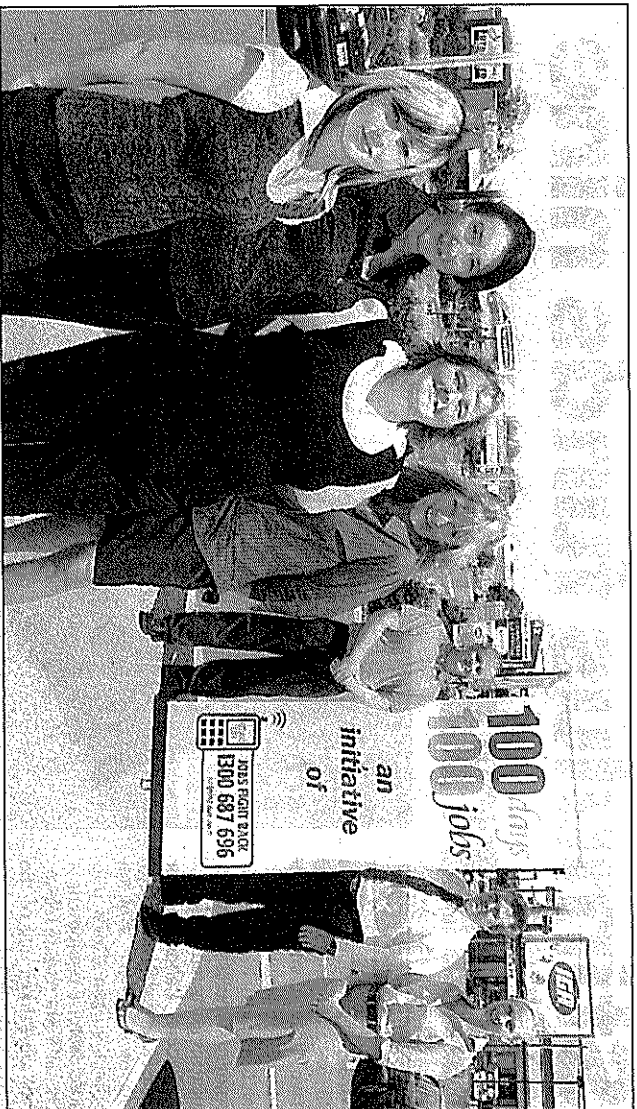

"INSTEAD of employers putting out advertisements and job-seekers applying for everything so employers have to go through lots of interviews and applications, employers can pick their staff from our descriptions and get the right person for the job straight away," Mr Conley said.

Damon Pownell of the *Bayside Bulletin* said the newspaper was very happy to be supporting the initiative.

"In the wake of the global financial crisis, we want to make sure our community is not left behind," Mr Pownell said.

"Employers want to be able to find local, qualified people, ready to go, and minimise the process of sifting through applicants. This answers that desire."
